# **Harvest Co-op Trial Member**

Do you want to be part of creating a better food system?

Are you interested in being an active member of a small workers' co-operative based in Okehampton?

Would you like to help increase access to organic food and explore regenerative ways to raise awareness about the key role farming and food plays on our health, the environment and the local economy?

We are looking for a passionate, flexible and committed person to join our team. This will initially be as a trial co-op member for 10 hours a week in our farm shop with an opportunity-to increase your hours if you are interested in growing your role within our organisation. You will play an active role in strategic planning and practical decision making using consensus and will also have the possibility to become a full member of our workers' co-op after a successful trial year.

### **ABOUT US**

Harvest Workers Co-op is not for profit workers co-operative based in Okehampton with 4 working members. We run a small farm shop and mobile shop supporting local and organic producers as well as a wide and engaging program of community and education activities and events on everything food and farming related. We have been trading in Okehampton for over-5 years and in this time we have developed a diverse range of projects and partnerships to advance our aims which are:

- To increase access to local organic and sustainable food in our community
- To support local producers using organic and ecological methods of farming
- To enable understanding of the social, environmental and health issues around food and farming through our educational and community program of events and activities
- To contribute to building food sovereignty and community strength and to the development of a healthy and resilient local food system

We agree as members to abide by cooperative values and principles, to give training in these principles and practice, to promote the physical, emotional and mental well-being of our members / employees and a regard for this with our community in general.

## **THE ROLE: Trial Co-op Member**

#### **TERMS and CONDITIONS**

The initial post is for one year working 10 hours/week at £10/hour PAYE. All members of the co-op are paid at the same rate. There will be a pay review in April 2023 The 10 hours will be split into two 5-hour shifts, This will involve some weekend working and would most probably be Wednesday and Saturday morning (8.30-1.30) however this is negotiable. In addition there will be a monthly meeting of 3 hours (paid) with the team.

You will have an induction and receive training in all aspects of your work.

You will be required to spend time as a lone worker once trained up.

You will be required to have a DBS check due to the nature of our work in the community You will have specific tasks to carry out for the co-op during your working hours. We are all responsible for every aspect of running the co-op from finance and management decisions to cleaning, ordering and collecting deliveries. These will be worked out together and may change from time to time to help with understanding different roles.

There may be extra hours available for team cover during the 12 months.

There will be the opportunity to work with other team members from time to time and one of the team will be allocated to meet with you for an hour every week during your working hours.

A willingness to help us to develop and implement our environmental plan.

A willingness to help us develop and record our social impact.

You will be entitled to annual leave and can opt to join our pension scheme.

There will be a 6 month review of your trial period

- 1. Opening and closing shop and preparing it for trade according to agreed procedures.
- 2. Creating attractive displays and restocking through the day as needed.
- 3. Serve and engage with customers in an efficient, friendly and helpful manner.
- 4. Receiving, checking and sorting deliveries. Please note that this will involve lifting heavy sacks and crates.
- 5. Preparing veg boxes for collection and/or delivery.
- 6. Operate till, handle cash and card transactions and cashing-up.
- 7. Use email to send orders and to reply to queries.
- 8. Stocking, replenishing and cleaning the shop.
- 9. Adhere to H&S and hygiene procedures of HWC.
- 10. Multi task and work in the most effective and efficient manner in order to contribute to the success of the business.
- 11. Actively promote our principles.
- 12. Demonstrate worker self-management as well as team work.
- 13. Communicate openly and honestly and be supportive and respectful to colleagues.
- 14. Develop, promote and adhere to best practice and to agreed systems and procedures.
- 15. Attend a monthly meeting with HWC team and take a full part in practical and strategic discussion and decision making.
- 16. Work co-operatively and take on responsibility for the success and development of the team and the co-operative as a whole.
- 17. Take on specific responsibilities/tasks as agreed at the beginning of each year and report on these at monthly meetings.
- 18. To seek and undertake training and personal development in order to be a more effective member and collective manager.
- 19. Any other duties that are reasonable.
- 20. Explore and engage in ways to develop your role including writing funding bids if appropriate.
- 21. Be part of helping organise the Harvest community events program.
